#### News from Mr Edwards-Grundy

This week in Collective Worship we concluded our exploration of the Value of Wisdom. We reflected on what we had all learned so far, thinking about the important difference between knowledge and Wisdom and recalling examples of Wisdom and our other Values that inform wise choices.

For our Bible reading we looked at a Bible story where Jesus meets a woman at a well, he asks the woman for a drink. The woman is surprised that Jesus would dare to ask her for a drink, she was a Samaritan woman and Jesus a Jewish man – Jews and Samaritans did not mix with each other at that time. Their conversation took a surprising turn when Jesus told the woman that he was a source of living water and that whoever drinks the water he gives will never be thirsty again.

Together we thought about what Jesus could possibly have meant by what he was saying to the woman and how this would help us in our thinking about Wisdom.

Your children thought really carefully and were able to express their thoughts to their friends and to us as adults. Together we concluded that Jesus was telling the woman that if she believed in him, if she chose to live his way, then she would always have the resources that she needed for her life. Wisdom is to be found in living the way that Jesus has told us to live, following his Values.

All that discussion led us back to the Proverbs about Wisdom that we had explored at the beginning of April, reminding us that it is better to get Wisdom than to get gold.

At least reflecting for myself, I know that I always need more Wisdom! There are always fresh challenges to face, difficult decisions to make and I am aware of the fallibility of my thinking. It has been a good reminder this week, every time I have gone into the staffroom, to see this quote from the book of James, chapter 1 verse 5.

'If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.'

I believe that where I am lacking, I can ask God and he will fill in the gaps – all I have to do is ask. But as I do so I am reminded that our next Value is Patience and sometimes I have to wait for Wisdom, it is not instant, or easy. Wisdom can take time, it requires us to pause, to allow for reflection and thinking about others rather than simply how to get our own way.

I hope you all enjoy the long Bank Holiday weekend and that where you are in need of it, you will find Wisdom.




## More News from Around the School






















#### Upcoming events, dates for your diary


