This week in Collective Worship we have begun to light the candles on our Advent wreath. The first candle on the wreath signifies Hope, which provided a great link between our Value of last month and of this month.

Our new Value is Thankfulness, which is a great Value to be exploring as we head towards Christmas. Whatever our circumstances, we all have a lot for which to be thankful. Over the remaining weeks of term I am really looking forward to exploring with your children all that we have to be thankful for.

Lighting of the Advent wreath reminds us all (as if a reminder were needed) that Christmas is coming. For Christians, Christmas is the pivotal moment in history. The Bible is a story that begins in one garden and ends in another. The Garden of Eden, at the start of the Bible, begins as a place of beauty and promise but quickly becomes corrupted by human greed and a desire to be like God. The Garden at the end of the Bible is a place we are still awaiting, a place where all the wrongs will be put right and the beauty of the Garden of Eden will be restored.

The Christmas story sits mid-way on the journey between the gardens. For Christians, the arrival of Jesus, who walked the earth and whose life is recorded in the annals of history, is the moment that makes the journey from garden to garden possible. Without Jesus, there is no possibility of the second garden, where tears are no longer and everything that has gone wrong is made right again.


