This week in Collective Worship we brought all of our thinking around Trust together, remembering all that we have learned and how we can apply this to our lives.

It was a great joy to listen to three children from Year 6 talking about how they have developed Trust in themselves and in what they can achieve. Edward talked about how frightened he had been at Quinta when asked to climb the rock face, but how putting his trust in the instructors and the equipment he had found the courage he needed to abseil down the huge rockface. Megan talked about how hard she has always found writing, but how she has learned to trust all that she has been taught and how much pleasure she now gains from her writing. (So do we Megan!) Olivia talked about how Maths has always made her feel like a rabbit in the headlights, but how she has learned to trust the techniques she has been shown and now feels less afraid.

For our Bible reading we looked at the verses from Proverbs chapter 3 that say:

'Trust in the Lord with all your heart. Never rely on what you think you know. Remember the Lord in everything you do, and he will show you the right way.'

Together we talked about how Christians believe that they can have help in the decisions that they make, that they can ask God for help and that he will show them how to behave and how to make good decisions.

We remembered together that living by our Values helps us all to live well as a community and how if we trust in our Values, we can find ways to flourish together, even though we are very different and we don't all like the same things.

Please do support The Friends next week at our Christmas fete, which is taking place straight after school on Wednesday 6th December.


