#### Keeping safe

Over the summer months, many of your children have enjoyed playing outside in the sunshine, but now that the nights are drawing in, we would like to share with you some important safety advice.

- Always make sure you know who your child is with and where they are going.
- Have an agreed time for your child to be home and make sure they know what to do if they cannot make it home by that time.
- If they are on a bike, make sure they have a helmet and that their bike has lights.
- Make sure your child knows what to do in an emergency, if they are hurt, or do not feel safe.
- Talk to your child about safe behaviours, especially around water or near roads.
- Encourage your child to talk to you about what they have been doing whilst they have been out and to share any concerns with you.
- Consider sharing supervision with other parents so that there is always an adult with your children, particularly where you also have younger children.

# Cogges Farm Museum is collecting people's memories

We want a more detailed and thorough history of Cogges, told by those who know and knew it best. Cogges has an amazing 1000-year plus history and there are lots of people who have a connection to it. Did you, or someone you know, work at Cogges, or for the Mawles (the last family to own and work the land at Cogges)? Have you visited the farm as a child, or as an adult?

Many people have a story to tell that enhances our history, and no one has captured this oral history of Cogges before. Attempts have been made in the past to collect certain recollections on how Cogges was run during the Victorian period but there is much more to the history of Cogges that remains to be captured.
