
R.E. Curriculum



Through religious education, we hope to cultivate a reflective approach to life and enable the children to appreciate the contribution that religious and spiritual ideas can make to their personal search for meaning and purpose in life. We strive to provide high quality RE lessons in enjoyable ways which excite the children's curiosity, imagination and involvement and which engage them in meaningful discussion, debate and questioning.

Through terms one to four, we explore Christianity and hope to encourage a greater understanding of the distinctive Christian nature of The Blake School. Through terms five and six, we study aspects of Judaism, Hinduism and Islam. Throughout the year, we encourage the understanding of and respect for diversity and difference between the children's own personal views and the view of different faith communities.

At the Blake School, we employ an enquiry-based approach to learning where each unit begins with a 'Big Question', which the children can instantly engage with, regardless of their own beliefs and worldviews. Throughout the course of the unit, an enquiry takes place as a class to explore the 'Big Question', in which the children are co-travellers on the journey. Each RE lesson will provide an opportunity to explore, build knowledge and understanding, and reflect on the subject of the enquiry. By the end of the unit, each child reflects on what they have learned throughout the enquiry to reach their own conclusion based on evidence. Throughout the unit, children will have the opportunity to explore the 'Big Question' using four main elements: story, questioning, experience and debate.
