News from Mr Edwards-Grundy

This week in Collective Worship, we continued to think about our Value of Service.

We had lots of fun, playing a mad game with a builder's tape measure and Maltesers – do ask your children for a demonstration! The point of the game was to illustrate Service and to lead us into our discussion about what Service means for each of us and for us as a community.

Our Bible reading was taken from Matthew chapter 25.

'For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was ill and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me. The King will say, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

This passage led us on to thinking about why it is not enough to simply think good things, or even say helpful things, we need to act. The Bible puts it well in James chapter 2 –

"If one of you says, 'Go in peace; keep warm and well fed', but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."

Our actions should reflect what we are thinking; our thoughts should lead us into action. This was beautifully demonstrated by the cake sale after school on Wednesday. A child in Year 3 thought about the people suffering in Libya and Morocco, but he didn't simply leave the thought where it was, he turned it into action. He spoke to his class teacher and then to me and his thought led to others baking and still more of you buying and £180.76 being raised for the Red Cross Emergency Fund. That money will go towards food, clothing, shelter and emergency relief. Thank you to everyone that helped turn thought into action.

As I walk around the school, I am often humbled by the way in which members of our community serve one another. Your children go out of their way to serve their peers. As so often, your children are an example to us as adults; we all too often have very good reasons why we don't translate our thoughts into actions, whereas your children see a need and reach out to meet it.

For me this week, the challenge is those words from James, asking myself afresh whether my faith can be seen in my actions, or whether I need to better follow the example of your children.

A big well done to the children who this week were awarded a Values Certificate.

Certificates this week were given for showing courage, perseverance, caring for others, showing kindness and for settling well into a new school.

The Friends events






News from Around the School
