News from Mr Edwards-Grundy

This week's Collective Worship saw us bring together all of the thinking that we have done over the past month about our Value of Kindness.

As always, your children were able to recall all that we have discussed and I know that many of them have been actively trying to be kinder to their friends, teachers and classmates.

During Collective Worship we read (and enjoyed acting out) the story of Zacchaeus. You can find the full story in the Gospel of Luke, chapter 19, verses 1 - 10.

Zacchaeus was a tax collector, nobody liked him. Tax collectors were known to cheat the people, lining their own pockets as they collected money for the Romans.

Jesus called out to Zacchaeus, and went with him to eat at his house. This was radical kindness, it was a clear message to everyone that it doesn't matter who you are, or what you have done, Jesus still loves you.

We were all challenged, thinking of how we might be called to show acts of radical kindness to people who no-one else likes, or who we might think have made bad choices in life. We all realised that kindness can be very costly.

Together we read a few verses from the Bible (Romans 12 vs 17-21) -

'Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. If your enemy is hungry, feed him, if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. Do not repay evil with evil.'

Jesus showed kindness to Zacchaeus, he ate with him, visited his house, he showed him that there was a different way to live. And Jesus' kindness brought about an enormous change in Zacchaeus' life. Zacchaeus promised to give back what he had stolen and repay four times as much to everyone he had cheated.

The story of Zacchaeus reminded us all that kindness can make an enormous difference. A small act of kindness can change not just someone's day, but maybe, like Zacchaeus, their whole life.

I wonder what acts of kindness will be shown within our school community in the coming days, and what impact that might have on individuals and on our whole community – I look forward to hearing from the children where they have seen kindness make a difference.
