This week in Collective Worship we lit the second of our Advent Candles. The second candle represents 'Peace'. Together we read two short Bible passages, including some words of Jesus, recorded in John chapter 14 verse 27 -

'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts your heart be troubled and do not be afraid.'

We began by laughing at Mrs Piper's sign, which says 'This year group is only silent at night!' and moved on to thinking about how we can help ourselves to be peaceful. Together we slowed our breathing down and thought about things that we are thankful for, the things God has given us and the things that bring light into our world.

In the midst of the business of this school season, we all enjoyed the moments of quiet!

We thought also about how God can give us Peace, even when our lives are busy and even when there seem to be a lot of hard things to work out.

I challenged your children to think about five things that their parents do for them and to be thankful for them. I wonder if your children can share with you the five things they thought of, or perhaps they even managed to remember to say thank you to you!

This week it has been a real joy to see the children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 perform the Nativity Story. There is always something magical about children dressed up as angels, shepherds and mice and it is wonderful to see their confidence shine as they speak their wellrehearsed lines with such clarity. For Christians however, the Nativity is much more than a lovely story that children love to perform and at which parents shed a tear. The Nativity Story, so simple that even our youngest children can re-tell it, is central to the Christian faith. It is the story of God coming down to earth to become like one of us.
