This morning it was an enormous pleasure when four children came down to my office to share with me their work. With the additional hours of support that we have put into every year group, children are being supported to make rapid progress. We know that children who are well supported and settled are best placed to make really strong academic progress, and so across the school we will continue to retain our focus on both.




## News from around the school

Mr Grundy talked to children who have done things that have really made a difference. Sophia has done lots to raise awareness of cerebral palsy and Bea donated her hair to the Princess Trust.

In their classes, children also began thinking about the gifts they have and how they can use these to make earth a bit more like heaven.

Mrs Rowlands challenged the children to think about the difference between what they need and what it is nice to have. The children then drew pictures reflecting on what they need each day.
