Together we thought about a verse from chapter 8 of the Gospel of John -

Jesus said, 'If you hold to my teaching you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth and the truth will set you free.'

We thought about how the Values we learn about in Collective Worship and that we practice day-byday reflect Jesus' teaching and how living to those Values can set us free. Your children could think of lots of examples of the ways in which living to the Values makes our community a safe and happy place in which to learn.

As was my experience after stealing chocolates, actually being 'found out' is often a relief – the truth really can set us free. Children know (as do we as adults) that waiting to be found out is a horrible feeling, the fear of consequences and lies unravelling is a horrible feeling. Once the truth is out however, there is a way forward, restoration can be made and forgiveness can be found. Finding the courage to tell the truth can be a real challenge, but it is only in doing so that we can experience the truth of the verse we shared – the truth will set you free.

Values Awards

Week by week we give out certificates to children who have shown our Values in a particularly noteworthy way. Giving out the certificates is a real privilege and I delight to shake children by the hand and congratulate them. However, as I walk around school, I see countless acts and decisions that are a deliberate choice to show our Values. Well done to all the children for all that you do to make our school community such a special place.
