Over the weekend, Mrs Harwood had stuck all of the jigsaw pieces together to make the heart. The gold lines between the pieces of the heart reflect the other Kintsugi art that the children completed during the week. Kintsugi meaning 'joining with gold' is part of a Japanese tradition where imperfections are highlighted, rather than hidden.

During the week children tore pictures, broke pottery and cut up art work before gluing and sticking it back together and decorating the joins with gold pens and paint.

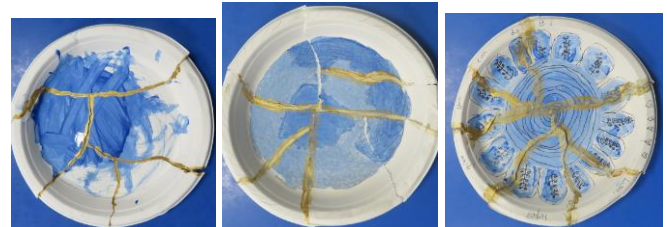
